Overview



LAST MINUTE INFORMATION ON KYOTO CONGRESS

The 15th International Congress of Therapeutic Drug Monitoring and Clinical Toxicology (IATDMCT 2017) will be held soon in Kyoto, Japan, during September 24th – 27th for the main Congress and on September 28th for the Post-Congress meeting. The Scientific program covers high-quality and multidisciplinary applications of TDM and CT science consisting of 3 plenary lectures, 4 award lectures, 19 symposia (60 invited speakers), 19 selected oral presentations, 58 oral presentations, 285 poster presentations, 17 industrial workshops and 15 exhibitors. At the Post-Congress meeting, 10 speakers will present the current consensus and guidelines on TDM. Furthermore, you have a chance to meet and discuss with distinguished experts at the roundtable discussion every morning. So many attractive programs are scheduled every day and you can learn everything about TDM and CT during the Kyoto Congress.

A total of 362 submitted papers will be presented at symposia, and general oral and poster sessions. These papers are submitted from 33 countries across the globe, indicating the science and clinical implementation of TDM and CT are definitely expanding world-wide. In this issue of the Compass, we provide useful last minute information for the Kyoto Congress for attendants and accompanying persons.

Climate of Kyoto

Japan is blessed with four beautiful seasons and Kyoto is the place where the distinct beauty of each season can be most appreciated. September is late summer and is one of the best seasons along with spring to visit Kyoto. Mild and sunny weather prevails on most days; the average temperature in September is 24°Cand 68% humidity. Occasionally typhoons come to Japan during summer time, but you do not need to worry. Kyoto is a safe place and typhoons pass quickly leaving beautiful blue skies and sunshine.

How to Access the Congress Venue (Kyoto International Conference Center)

Access to Kyoto from international and domestic airports was described in the Compass, March 2017. After you reach the Kyoto railway station, you take a subway Karasuma Line for Kokusai-kaikan station. The Congress venue is located within a 5-minute walk from Kokusai-kaikan station. Please walk through underground passage to Exit 4-2. The covered walkway from Exit 4-2 guides you to the front entrance of the Kyoto International Conference Center (ICC Kyoto).

ICC Kyoto was designed under the concept of "humans gathering and conversing within nature," and has a Japanese garden that borrows the scenery of the picturesque Lake Takaragaike.





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The 'IATDMCT-JSTDM Joint Symposium: Expansion and Evolution of TDM and CT' on Sunday, September 24th is an opening scientific session commencing the IATDMCT Congress, followed by the Opening Ceremony and Opening Reception. In the joint symposium, participants can learn the history and activity of IATDMCT and how TDM/CT contributed to clinical service and improving clinical outcome.

Three plenary speakers will give state-of-the-art lectures on mass spectrometry, TDM of biologics and new biomarkers. Most of symposia were originally proposed by the IATDMCT scientific committees and rearranged by the local organizing committee. Since many Asian members are expected to attend, symposium 'TDM in Asia' on Monday offers an opportunity to exchange current status of TDM in Asian countries and discuss future directions. During the Kyoto Congress, a new scientific committee 'Environmental Health and Toxicology' will launch and its kick-off symposium will be held on Wednesday, September 27th.

At the Post-Congress meeting on Thursday, September 28th, delegates



from the IATDMCT or JSTDM scientific committees will talk on current or ongoing Guidelines and Consensus Documents for TDM. The awards for best oral presentation and best poster seem highly competitive because so many high-quality papers will be presented in the Kyoto Congress.

All participants are encouraged to visit sponser booths at the exhibition during the Congress. Congress participants who have visited 10 exhibitor booths and got their Exhibition Passport stamped at every booth can receive a 'Two-day Pass of Kyoto Bus and Subway'. Programs for Accompanying Persons

1. Calligraphy experience

Calligraphy or 'Shodo' in Japanese is the art of writing Chinese characters (known as 'kanji') as well as two Japanese syllabaries (known as 'kana') using brushes, ink and traditional paper. This course offers you a unique experience of Shodo as an important part of Japanese culture. First-timers are welcome since good Shodo tutors teach you how to write kanji for beginning level of calligraphy.



2. Tea Ceremony

Tea ceremony (referred as 'Sado' in Japanese which means a formal way of tea) is a traditional ritual influenced by Zen Buddhism. Powdered green tea ('matcha') is ceremonially prepared by adding hot water and mixing it with a bamboo whisk. Then tea is served to a small number of guests one by one in a traditional Japanese tea room.





3. Origami experience

Origami (Paper folding), one of the Japan's unique arts, is now famous throughout the world. Square pieces of paper are folded into various shapes such as birds, animals or flowers. First-timers are welcome since good tutors teach you how to make an origami work.


